THE 2020 ARCTIC WINTER GAMES

The Arctic Winter Games is a high profile circumpolar sport competition for northern and arctic athletes. The Games provide an opportunity to strengthen sport development in the participants' jurisdictions, to promote the benefits of sport, to build partnerships, and to promote culture and values. The Games celebrate sport, social exchange and cultures. The Games provide an opportunity for the developing athlete to compete in friendly competition while sharing cultural values from northern regions around the world

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS – TEAM NUNAVUT COACHES

The Nunavut Soccer Association is accepting applications for volunteer Coach positions for the 2020 Arctic Winter Games men and women teams. The 2020 Arctic Winter Games will take place in Whitehorse, YK, March 2020.

Selected coaches will work with NSA Executive Director to complete full team training plan. This must be completed by December 2018.

ROLE

Working together with the Nunavut Soccer Association and Sport Nunavut, the volunteer coaching staff play a lead role in the selection, training, supervision, and guidance of athletes attending the Games. Coaching staff will travel with their team to and from Whitehorse and stay in the designated Team Nunavut accommodations. Coaching staff are responsible for the supervision of their athletes for the duration of the Games. Coaching staff are required to abide by the policies; rules and regulations; and other guidelines handed down by Team Nunavut, the AWGIC and the AWG 2020 Host Society.

COACH RESPONSIBILITIES

Coaches will be responsible for developing and delivering a strong comprehensive team strategy and to prepare the team for competition at AWG. The goal is to produce strong, competitive athletes who maintain a high degree of respect, honour and sportsmanship during the entirety of the Games. Coaches are also responsible for the supervision of their athletes through the duration of AWG. Coach responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Prepare team selection and training plan by December 2018 and submit to NSA Board of Directors
- Participate in selection event(s) and processes; Make decisions on final roster selections;
- Be available for the “Important Dates” outline in Section C of this document
- Train and prepare athletes for competition;
- Lead the scheduling and planning of training camp;
- Build a positive and achievement oriented team environment;
- Ensure good communication with parents/athletes regarding team activities, plans, etc.;
- Provide tips and guidance on training to athletes – including what they can do on their own;
- Monitor and evaluate the performance of athletes and provide appropriate feedback;
- Teach the necessary skills, techniques and strategies for team play;
- Have full understanding of the rules used for AWG competition;
- Coaches are responsible for the handling and submission of any protest procedures for their team;
- Abide by the policies; rules and regulations; and other guidelines handed down by the Nunavut Soccer Association, Sport Nunavut, the AWGIC and the AWG 2020 Host Society;
- Review with your athletes and their parents the Team Nunavut Code of Conduct, its contents reviewed, acknowledged and signed;
- Adhere to the NSA Code of Ethics and Code of Conduct;
- Responsible for the supervision, discipline and conduct of the players at all times through AWG;
- Responsible for ensuring that the players are properly dressed at all times in designated attire;
- Participate in all required coaches conference calls and meetings as required by Sport Nunavut and AWG;
- Will be answerable to the Nunavut Soccer Association and Team Nunavut for their training methods and the overall conduct of the team on/off the field.
- Act at all times in a responsible manner displaying good sportsmanship and positive role modeling and ensuring that their behaviour reflects favourably on Team Nunavut.
- Awareness of safety-first and emergency procedures.

QUALIFICATIONS/REQUIREMENTS

- Must be 21 years of age +
- A minimum of NCCP certification in their respective sport is preferred.
- Successful applicants will be required to sign and adhere to a strict code of conduct, which prohibits the consumption of alcohol and the use of illicit drugs during all events leading up to and including the 2020 AWG.
- Must agree to undergo a Criminal Record Check.
